

# COMMUNITY INCLUSION LEVELS OF INCLUSION

**Example:**

*Emma is a 38 year old woman who lives in the residential services of Path Services. She also uses the day service of Path Services.*

*Emma has various levels of inclusion in her community through her socially valued roles.*

*This community inclusion level tool is based on the roles already being enjoyed by Emma at the start of this course.*

**Levels Key:**

- 1 - Physically present but not included.
- 2 - Physically present and known by name.
- 3 - Moderately levels of inclusion.
- 4 - Very included.

**Explanation:**

Role 1 - Emma is very included in her socially valued role of employment - she is known well by all the staff and attends all social events that she wishes to part-take in such as Social nights, parties at Christmas and Halloween and Emma’s boss misses her on the days she is not there. Emma has her own set tasks that no-one else completes.

Role 2 - Emma is moderately included in her family – she makes and receives regular phone calls and goes home every second weekend. Emma’s brother and sister live at home with her parents and they support Emma in whatever activities she wishes to try. Emma expressed that she would like to go to family functions of her wider family such as weddings and birthday parties.

Role 3 - Gym Member – Emma has been a member of the local gym for the past 2 years. However when she arrives she is not addressed by name. Emma is not invited to any of the gym’s events such as fundraisers or parties.

Role 4 - Volunteer – Emma has been a volunteer with the local tidy towns committee for the past year. She is known by name but not contacted directly by the association. Emma would like to be made aware of meetings and events by receiving a phone call directly from the association and has asked for help with this.
